ABSTRACT REQUIREMENTS

1. The language of abstracts is **English**.
2. Deadline for abstract submission is **29 November 2022**.
3. The abstract content is the sole responsibility of the authors.
4. Abstracts must include original research findings from the period of the last three years.
5. Information that is not provided in English must be written in *Italic*.
6. The total length of the abstract must not exceed 500 words
7. The maximum number of keywords is 7.

Results. Type your introduction here in Times New Roman, Font 11, single space. Indicate only those results that are relevant to the aim and conclusion sections.

Conclusion. Type your introduction here in Times New Roman, Font 11. The conclusion section must describe the outcome of the Results section and must clearly be linked to "Research aim", answering the question of whether the research aim was attained.
